Well, we almost made it through a whole week of school. The kids are doing well; they are making the adjustment to Kindergarten. One of the biggest issues we have had is following directions and learning how important it is to **listen**. They have so much to say, but it is not always their turn.

A look at the week:

Math: We worked on addresses, phone numbers the concepts of all, some and none. We also learned about always, maybe and never and before and after.

Reading: We are learning about the difference between capital and lower case letters, how letters make words and introduced the “popcorn” word “The”. We read the first little decodable book ,The House. We are also learning nursery rhymes.

Centers: The children have been busy learning what is in each center and how to use each item.

A look ahead:

Math: Days of the week, yesterday, today and tomorrow, day and night and shapes.

Reading: Rhyming words, first, next and last and sequencing events in a story. Introduce the “popcorn” word “a”.

Centers: We will continue exploring the centers and start some nursery rhyme activities.

We have started handwriting, please practice with your child the correct way to form the letters, I have attached a copy of the letters as a reminder of how we write in Kindergarten. Please work on this with your child, it is very important.
