6th Grade Math: Students will begin working on standard 6.NS.1 which includes dividing fractions. There will be a classwork grade this week.

7th Grade Math: Students will continue working on standard 7.RP.3. This standard includes multi-step percent and ratio problems. There is a possible classwork grade this week.
